Section 13-1-126 NMSA 1978 states in pertinent part that "A. A contract may be awarded without competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals regardless of the estimated cost when the state purchasing agent or a central purchasing office determines, in writing, that:

- (1) there is only one source for the required service, construction or item of tangible personal property;
- (2) the service, construction or item of tangible personal property is unique and this uniqueness is substantially related to the intended purpose of the contract; and
- (3) other similar services, construction or items of tangible personal property cannot meet the intended purpose of the contract.

B. The state purchasing agent or a central purchasing office shall use due diligence in determining the basis for the sole source procurement, including reviewing available sources and consulting the using agency, and shall include its written determination in the procurement file."

The Purchasing Department has:

- Reviewed the justification submitted to this office;
- Reviewed the steps taken by the User Department in conducting a good-faith review of available sources;
- Reviewed the Vendor's Sole Source letter;
- Conducted research on other firms offering similar products.

The DAC Health and Human Services Department provided Purchasing with the Sole Source Justification Form, Cancer Aid Resources & Education (CARE) Sole Source Letter and Cost Proposal. The County's Certified Chief Procurement Officer from examining the sole source documents and researching the internet has determined that CARE is the sole source provider of financial assistance for non-medical needs for patients with any type of cancer in Dona Ana County. This sole source request was posted on the County website on 08/20/2020 for 30 days.

Financial assistance provided will be for non-medical needs, basic living needs, and medical travel.

Financial assistance provided for Doña Ana County residents recently diagnosed with any type of cancer and their family in order for patient to concentrate on treatment, healing, recovery, and survival.

HHS researched local agencies that provide **financial assistance for patients with cancer for non-medical needs**. Cancer Aid Resource & Education, Inc. (CARE) was the only service provider that offers the unique service. Other service providers listed are limited to service area or type of cancer patients have. (CARE proposal and New Mexico Cancer Support and Treatment 2020 Directory is Attached)

Financial assistance includes: gas cards to get to treatment, other transportation needs, groceries and nutritional supplements, self-pay health insurance, utilities, rent or mortgage payments, telephone, etc. If treatment requires medical travel outside of the county, CARE helps with lodging, airfare, meals, gas cards, parking, etc.

AMOUNT REQUESTED: \$25,000 – Term July 1, 2021 to June 31, 2022	
NEEDS STATEMENT: Considering Doña Ana County's high cancer mortality rate, proximity to the US-Mexico border, its large Hispanic population, lower income levels and higher poverty rate, it is crucial to address the need to reduce the cancer health disparities in Doña Ana County.	
PROJECT SUMMARY:	
CARE – Cancer Aid Resource & Education, Inc. serves the people of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County. CARE offers “hands on” support for the individual and family dealing right here, right now with the reality of cancer. CARE’s CARE Support Program helps with financial assistance for non-medical needs, basic living needs. Financial assistance includes: gas cards to get to treatment, other transportation needs, groceries and nutritional supplements, self pay health insurance, utilities, rent or mortgage payments, telephone, etc. If treatment requires medical travel outside of the county, CARE helps with lodging, airfare, meals, gas cards, parking, etc. Assistance is provided so that local cancer patients can concentrate on treatment, healing, recovery and survival. If our assisted cancer patient dies from cancer and they have no life insurance or enough funds, we will assist with cremation.	
OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT:	
Cancer brings devastation to individuals and families, yet the suffering goes far beyond diagnosis and treatment. For low and middle income families, cancer can result in a financial burden so profound that the National Cancer Institute has coined the term “financial toxicity” to describe the financial crisis of a cancer diagnosis. This financial burden doesn’t just create high rates of emotional distress; it also negatively affects patient outcomes and quality of life for the whole family. CARE is about helping the people of Doña Ana County <u>today</u> , local people recently diagnosed with any type of cancer and in treatment to cure, shrink or stop the progression of their cancer. CARE created the CARE Support Program to help on the onset of a major cancer diagnosis and provide financial assistance for a defined period. Currently, CARE’s client base is ~50% of Doña Ana County residents. CARE will assist recently diagnosed eligible cancer patients residing in Doña Ana County with a maximum financial assistance cap amount of \$2,500 per patient, with the option of additional assistance provided for extreme hardship circumstances on a case by case basis. Cancer patients will be served month per month as needed. Doña Ana County funds of \$25,000 will be disbursed as follows: CARE will financially assist cancer patients who are residents of Doña Ana County and in active treatment on an “as needed” basis with the full \$25,000 requested. Up to 10+ patients per month can be served throughout the year. Most patients will complete the program when cap is reached for approved expenses. New patients may enter the program at any time. CARE can provide monthly accounting and data of county patients served with the \$25,000 requested.

VISION STATEMENT: "Our vision is that no cancer patient or family member in Doña Ana County will be without access to information and services."

When an individual hears the words, "You have cancer" everything in their life comes to a roaring stop. Fear and anxiety take over and not only for the person with the diagnosis, but for their whole family. People handle this hard time differently, but most, after a period, start looking into what their options are and where their supports might be.

That is where CARE comes in. We are not about cancer research or medical care – there are many fine organizations committed to research and medicine and they are doing incredible work. But, for the individual and family dealing right here, right now, with the reality of cancer, we offer "hands on" support. CARE's focus is to provide assistance to cancer patients who have recently been diagnosed with any type of cancer, within one year of a positive cancer diagnosis with a diagnostic biopsy. CARE assists cancer patients and their families to help them cope with their cancer treatment by assisting them with non-medical expenses/basic living needs expenses while they are in active treatment for any type of cancer. Active treatment usually may involve surgery and/or chemotherapy and/or radiation or a transplant. CARE's Care and Support Program helps with gas cards to get to treatment, utilities, groceries and nutritional supplements, rent or mortgage, and lodging if needing travel for treatment, etc. so that the patient can concentrate on treatment, healing, recovery and survival. We can connect them to community resources and information.

Almost all of us have been or will be touched by cancer in our lives. Someone we know and care about or even ourselves will hear those very hard words, "you have cancer". Our goal at CARE is to be sure that no one has to struggle with the necessities of life during that time. Our goal at CARE is to ensure that while families are dealing with cancer they have dignity and as much strength and courage as we can help provide.

The Cancer Plan describes what cancer looks like in New Mexico, including data on the most prevalent cancers, health inequities, and cancer care issues including prevention, detection, treatment and palliative care. It also contains goals and objectives for reducing the burden of cancer and addressing health inequities based on national objectives and issues unique to our state.

This year, the New Mexico Cancer Council is focusing its efforts on several priority areas, including addressing quality of life and colorectal cancer issues; improving rural health inequities; and promoting the 2018-2023 New Mexico Cancer Plan. 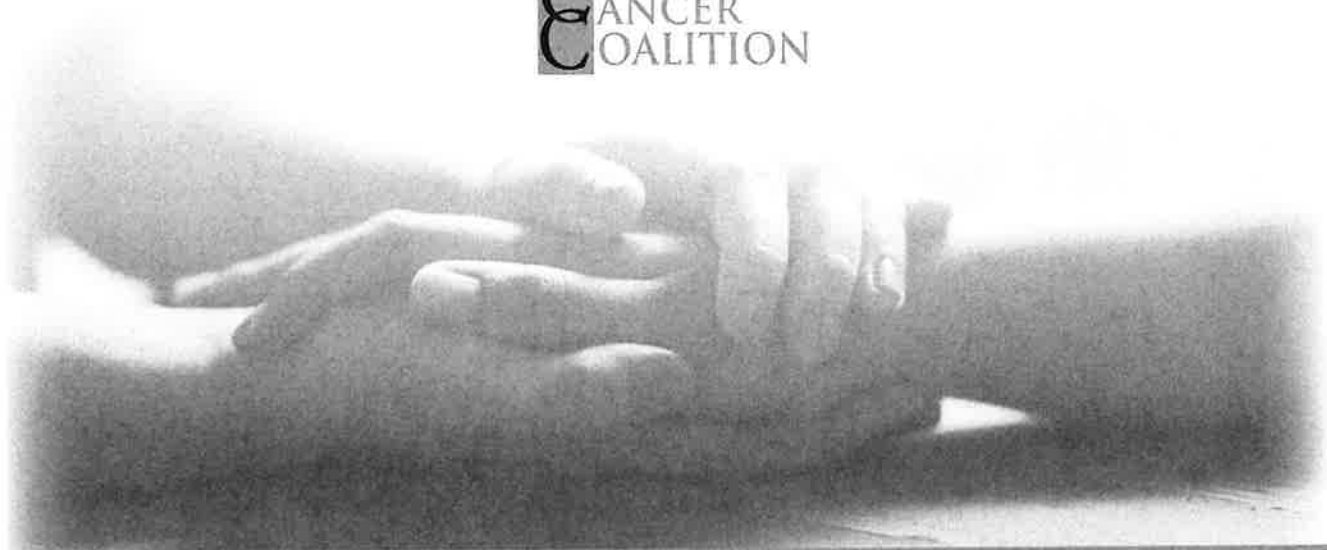
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
